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**Wilmington named HQ location for post-merger Specialty Products business**

A message from Ed Breen, Chair and CEO

As we proceed with our plans to merge with Dow, we also are working to define the future of the three industry-leading companies that subsequently will be created.

On December 29th, I announced that the corporate headquarters for the combined, post-merger Specialty Products business will be in Wilmington, Delaware – a positive step forward that brings more clarity to our direction and importantly to DuPont’s ongoing presence in Delaware.

By bringing together key assets and capabilities of DuPont and Dow, the Specialty Products company will become a new industry leader, focused on attractive markets where our innovation and science will give us a clear advantage. We also will have the scale we need to compete globally, as combined pro forma 2014 revenues for our Specialty Products businesses are approximately \$13 billion.

Specialty Products will include DuPont’s Nutrition & Health, Industrial Biosciences, Safety & Protection and Electronics & Communications, as well as the Dow Electronic Materials business. Our combined electronic businesses will be the clear technology leader with the broadest offering in the industry. And just like all of our newly created businesses, Specialty Products will be well positioned to thrive and grow, allowing for greater reinvestment back in the business. By creating innovation-driven growth, we ultimately will create new opportunities for employees, customers – and our home town of Wilmington.

With this announcement, we recognize that our colleagues working in our other businesses are looking for similar news on headquarters locations. The combined Material Science company will have corporate headquarters based in Midland, MI, and we are still evaluating potential corporate headquarter locations for our combined Agriculture business. I would note that corporate headquarters refers to where corporate staff positions will generally be located; it does not necessarily indicate a change in the location of other existing positions within the business.

We have much more work to do in the months ahead to prepare for our merger, and at times like these it is more important than ever to apply our Core Values to everything we do. As we work through the issues and challenges that come with change, our entire senior leadership team will continue to provide our colleagues with updates and specific information about our plan and progress as soon as we are able to share it.
