<b>Autocallable Market-Linked Step Up Notes Linked to an International Equity Index Basket</b>	
<b>Issuer</b>	BofA Finance LLC ( BofA Finance )
<b>Guarantor</b>	Bank of America Corporation ( BAC )
<b>Principal Amount</b>	\$10.00 per unit
<b>Term</b>	Approximately five years, if not called
<b>Market Measure</b>	An international equity index basket comprised of the EURO STOXX 50 <sup>®</sup> Index (Bloomberg symbol: SX5E ), the FTSE <sup>®</sup> 100 Index (Bloomberg symbol: UKX ), the Nikkei Stock Average Index (Bloomberg symbol: NKY ), the Swiss Market Index (Bloomberg symbol: SMI ), the S&P/ASX 200 Index (Bloomberg symbol: AS51 ) and the Hang Seng Index (Bloomberg symbol: HSI ). Each Basket Component is a price return index. The EURO STOXX 50 <sup>®</sup> Index will be given an initial weight of 40.00%, each of the FTSE <sup>®</sup> 100 Index and the Nikkei Stock Average Index will be given an initial weight of 20.00%, each of the Swiss Market Index and the S&P/ASX 200 Index will be given an initial weight of 7.50% and the Hang Seng <sup>®</sup> Index will be given an initial weight of 5.00%
<b>Automatic Call</b>	The notes will be called automatically on any Observation Date if the closing level of the Market Measure is equal to or greater than the Call Level
<b>Call Level</b>	100% of the Starting Value
<b>Observation Dates</b>	Approximately one year, two years, three years and four years from the pricing date
<b>Call Amount</b>	[\$10.85 to \$10.95] if called on the first Observation Date, [\$11.70 to \$11.90] if called on the second Observation Date, [\$12.55 to \$12.85] if called on the third Observation Date, and [\$13.40 to \$13.80] if called on the final Observation Date, each to be determined on the pricing date
<b>Payout Profile at Maturity</b>	If the Market Measure is flat or increases up to the Step Up Value, a return equal to the Step Up Payment  If the Market Measure increases above the Step Up Value, a return equal to the percentage increase in the Market Measure  1-to-1 downside exposure to decreases in the Market Measure beyond a 15% decline, with up to 85% of your principal at risk
<b>Step Up Value</b>	150% of the Starting Value
<b>Step Up Payment</b>	\$5.00 per unit, a 50% return over the principal amount
<b>Threshold Value</b>	85% of the Starting Value
